

RTX Listed as One of Britain's Fastest Growing Private Tech Businesses Global Capacity Exchange Business Ranked at No 18 in 2015 Tech Track 100

London – September 07, 2015 RTX has today announced it has been listed in the prestigious Sunday Times Tech Track 100, ranking as one of the top 20 fastest growing technology businesses in the UK.

The highly respected league table ranks Britain's 100 private Technology Media and Telecoms (TMT) companies with the fastest-growing sales over the latest three years. During this period, RTX has experienced sustained annual growth in excess of 127% – ranking it 18th in the table.

Apart from recording impressive year-on-year growth, RTX is one of the first UK-based telecoms businesses to rank so highly on the Tech Track 100 for a number of years.

“The UK is a hot-bed of innovation for telecoms, but while smartphone brands and internet players have stolen the limelight over the last few years we have developed a proposition that enables global telecoms operators to increase margin and drive revenue growth from the wholesale exchange of voice services,” said Albert Mackey, CEO of RTX.

Managing Director, Miles Esfahani added, “Carrier exchange activities have been driven by domestic and international demand for voice to support consumer and enterprise markets. Using our platform, telecom operators can exchange services, enter new markets and sell unused capacity. As a result we are currently managing the exchange of hundreds of millions of voice minutes a month over our public and private exchanges.”

Telecoms operators are risk-averse organisations and until recently the industry had concerns surrounding the quality, pricing and financial security of the wider wholesale telecoms marketplace. RTX's continued growth demonstrates the industry demand for a global capacity exchange that provided operators with a robust and financially secure environment to conduct transactions and enter into mutually beneficial agreements.

The financial risks associated with wholesale exchanges have now been removed and the entire payments process streamlined by the introduction of secure routing and settlement during the exchange of communication services, guaranteed by international banks.

Voice is only one of a number of core communication services that RTX support; there are plans to extend the platform's capabilities to manage the exchange of SMS and data services. The company recently introduced RTX Fast Pay, which expedites settlements across its exchange services, bridging the cash flow gap between operators buying and selling voice, SMS and data services.

Neil Kitcher, CMO concluded: “Tech Track has become the benchmark for the performance of privately owned technology companies in the UK and RTX's selection from over 600 entries is a reflection of the company's achievements. At RTX we identified an issue that had frustrated the telecoms wholesale industry for years and short space of time we have become the industry standard for global exchanges.”
